LEADING WITH THE TRANSFORMATION ON CULTURAL IDENTITY: THE CASE OF THE REFURBISHMENT OF GARCIMUNOZ CASTLE



Garcimuno Refurbishment in Cuenca, Spain is a project in which Dr Izaskun Chinchilla, her firm and a big group of advisors with Carlos Jimenez among them, have worked for over 13 years. The projects tries to put into value the former historical identity of a multi-layer Castle and to help with its transformation, embracing a new cultural identity for a very small rural village in Spain.

This experience of adaptive reuse of a medieval castle can be useful to update us of innovative ways by which cultural heritage can be conserved, and whether they may be applied to Sarawak. This topic can be explored at the talk. One possible example might be the restoration and adaptive reuse of our old Brooke Dockyard facilities.

Dr Izaskun Chinchilla is an Honor Fellow from Royal Institute of British Architects. In addition to being Principal Partner at Izaskun Chinchilla Architects, she is also Senior Teaching Fellow, Senior Research Associate and Public Engagement Fellow at the Bartlett School of Architecture, University College of London.
